Forensic Psychiatry Associate, Forensic Psychiatric Associates, Inc. Jul '22 – present

Description: I perform forensic psychiatric evaluations in civil and criminal legal matters and provide consultation to attorneys regarding issues at the interface of psychiatry and the law. Evaluations might include those for insanity, guilty but mentally ill, sentencing (mitigation, diminished capacity, automatism and other affirmative defenses), release of insanity acqutee, competency to stand trial, competency to testify, medical malpractice, emotional damage and psychiatric disability, worker's compensation, fitness for duty, guardianship, conservatorship, psychological autopsy, brain injury and memory impairment, suicide risk assessment, violence risk evaluation, sexual violence risk appraisal, and malingering evaluations.

Inpatient Psychiatrist, University of Utah Department of Psychiatry Jul '22 – present

Description: I am currently an assistant clinical professor working parttime on the inpatient psychiatric unit at the Huntsman Mental Health Institute. I evaluate and treat individuals with severe mental illness with pharmacotherapy and brief-interventional psychotherapies who require emergent hospitalization and care. Patient populations include those suffering from schizophrenia and other psychotic disorders, bipolar disorder, depressive disorders, posttraumatic stress and other trauma-related disorders, borderline personality disorder, and other neuropsychiatric conditions. I also instruct and supervise psychiatric trainees directly and through didactic teaching.

Outpatient Psychiatrist, University of Utah Department of Psychiatry Jul '22 – present

Description: I am currently an assistant clinical professor working parttime at the Huntsman Mental Health Institute Downtown Clinic. I evaluate and treat individuals with severe mental illness with pharmacotherapy, cognitive behavioral therapy, dialectic behavior therapy, acceptance and commitment therapy, and existential psychotherapy. Patient populations include those suffering from bipolar disorder, depressive disorders, anxiety disorders, posttraumatic stress and other trauma-related disorders, obsessive-compulsive disorder, borderline and other personality disorders, attention-deficit disorder, neurodevelopmental disorders, and other neuropsychiatric disorders that can be managed in the outpatient setting. I also instruct and supervise psychiatric trainees directly and through didactic teaching, both at the Huntsman Mental Health Institute Downtown Clinic and at Idaho State University Student Health Clinic in Pocatello, Idaho.

Psychiatric Consultant, University of Utah Department of Neurology Jul '22 – present

Description: My position with the Department of Neurology is as a specialized consultant. I see unique cases of neuropsychiatric concern that have been referred for psychiatric evaluation and treatment. My clinic functions through a collaborative and integrative care model to provide short and long term care for patients with neurocognitive disorders, neurodevelopmental disorders, movement disorders, autoimmune disorders, and other primary neurological conditions that entail concurrent psychiatric symptoms.

Forensic Psychiatry Assistant, Trent Holmberg, MD Oct '20 – June '21

Description: My role as a forensic psychiatry assistant was to review and summarize various medical records and legal documents to be included in forensics reports. This required attention to detail as well as efficiency to assure minimal charges were incurred to retaining parties.

Civil Commitment Designated Examiner, State of Utah Sept '20 – May '21

Description: As a designated examiner for the state of Utah, I evaluated patients in the Salt Lake City valley under civil commitment on a bi-weekly basis. I then testified as to their required level of psychiatric care, as well as their risk to self and others, guided by federal and state statutes for civil commitment. Ten to twenty patients were typically evaluated weekly with each individual requiring individual testimony and cross-examination.

Associate Physician and Director, Huntsman Mental Health Institute June '20 – June '21

Description: I served as both treating physician and director of clinical care, performing medical evaluations for inpatient admissions to the Huntsman Mental Health Institute. Additionally, I coordinated physician schedules and liaised between other associate physicians and the hospital system. Administratively, I was responsible for assuring quality care and billing metrics were met for all patient encounters.

Medical Director and Staff Physician, De Novo Services Jun '19 – Jan '21

Description: My roles at De Novo Services ranged from being a treating psychiatrist to medical director. The clinic offered psychiatric care for both civilian patients struggling with addiction (MAT) as well as medication management for patients under the purview of the Federal Bureau of Prisons. My role as a medical director entailed assuring compliance with federal and state guidelines in providing care for these individuals.

Consult and Liaison Psychiatrist, University of Utah Dec '18 – Dec '20

Description: As an employee at the University of Utah, I functioned as a consult-liaison psychiatrist. I corresponded with primary teams on a wide range of units including oncology, burn, neurology, surgical care units, Ob-Gyn, and ICU services one to two weekends per month. Consults conducted included new patient assessments and short-term follow-ups for those acute psychiatric and medical conditions.

Transition Psychiatrist, Huntsman Mental Health Institute Nov '18 – Nov '19

Description: As a psychiatrist in the University of Utah Transition Clinic, I saw patients recently discharged from inpatient psychiatric care. Many such individuals often experience significant lapses in time before outpatient treatment. My role was to bridge psychiatric care and management for these subacute patients and assess the need for varying levels of continued care.
